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
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The Priest-Martyr Mocius (Mokios)

Orthodox Thoughts from Theo, the Parish Possum

In the Russian and Ukrainian Orthodox Churches, the celebration of Pascha is followed closely by the Radonitsa holiday. It is observed nine days after, on the Tuesday following Bright Week. On this day, faithful

Orthodox Christians clean and decorate the graves of family and friends and say prayers for them. However, in the spirit of Pascha, it is not to cry for the dead but to feast with them. Radonitsa means "day of rejoicing." The custom goes back to the 4th Century and was promoted by St. John Chrysostom. At the grave, Paschal hymns and "Memory Eternal" are sung. Remaining Paschal foods are consumed, and a Paschal egg is placed on the graves with the chant "Christ is Risen". While this event for the dead may seem out of place during the Paschal season, it is consistent with the Orthodox faith's emphasis on resurrection to eternal life rather than on death. Bringing to the graveyard a festive spirit with foods, sweets and drink is a reminder that we will all be resurrected some day with Christ. Then, in our incorruptible bodies, we will eat and drink together with our loved ones. In the words of St. John Chrysostom's Paschal sermon: "O Death where is thy sting? O Hell, where is thy victory? Christ is risen, and thou art overthrown...Christ is risen, and life reigns. Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave. To him be glory and dominion unto the ages of ages."—Theo
